Spiritual Gifts

MERCY

Luke 10:30-37

Do you have a real heart for people? Do you feel tenderness toward others? Are you concerned with finding ways of showing kindness to people experiencing distress, crisis, or pain? You may have the gift of mercy. Those with a gift of mercy desire to see people who are hurting alleviated of their hurt. They have a great hope and desire to be able to help others by their presence and friendship.

Characteristics of someone with the gift of mercy: * Attentive - watchful over those who are in need, or have sorrow or trouble of any kind.

Characteristics of someone with the gift of mercy *(continued)*:

- * Sensitive aware of the needs in others, even without them saying anything.
- * Fair desiring impartiality and fairness.
- * Gentle soft-spoken, tender, and caring
- * Sacrificial willing to suffer if it will help another person

Tithing

II Corinthians 8:3-4 - Give sacrificially! "They gave as much as they were able and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service." People ask, "What if I can't afford to tithe?" The answer is, "You can't afford not to." If you want God's blessing on your finances, you need to give. You need to obey what God has said.

Tithing (10% of your income) gives God a chance to prove He exists and wants to bless you. Start tithing and watch what happens!

What are Sacrificial Promises? A prayed upon sacrificial amount <u>above</u> tithes and regular offerings resulting in consistent funds for capital improvement projects throughout the Highpoint property.

Sacrificial Promises Checkpoint Coming Soon!

A Sacrificial Promise Checkpoint is scheduled for The Church Anniversary on Sunday, Oct. 13th, 2013 at 3:00 P.M. This is one of two annual days at Highpoint where the total amount received for Sacrificial Promises from May through October 13th is reported at the end of the program. Highpoint members were asked to seek divine guidance in January and make a prayed-upon promise to the Lord toward Capital Improvement. The first checkpoint is always during Family and Friends Day in April and the second checkpoint is during the Church Anniversary in October of each year. The first checkpoint includes a total amount collected from January through April 28th. All prayed-upon sacrificial amounts above tithes and regular offerings result in consistent funds for capital improvement projects throughout the Highpoint property.

We no longer ask each family to give \$100.00 on annual days. Instead, we are asking all of our members, children and adults, to go in prayer and decide what they would like to sacrificially give. Once you decide what you would like to sacrificially give, you just start making payments. Fill out a church envelope and write your amount next to "Capital Improvement." You can make payments weekly, monthly, or spread payments over a year. Just remember - GOD LOVES A CHEERFUL GIVER!
